School has begun and Labor Day weekend signals the end of the summer vacation season. We will soon be into Fall fishing patterns on the Bay and are looking forward to the start of the Rockfish season in Virginia waters on October 4. Cobia season ends September 15 in Virginia waters, however remains open through the end of the year in Maryland waters and the Potomac River. Spanish Mackerel fishing has been steady in Virginia waters and in the lower Potomac River and has been reported to be productive in the Middle Grounds and Point Lookout areas of Maryland waters. Bluefish remain plentiful in the Bay and a few large Red Drum are also being caught and released.

Congratulations to the winners of the Spanish Lessons Tournament, sponsored by R.W.'s Sport Shop, which was scheduled for Saturday 8/19 and Sunday 8/20. Due to Small Craft Advisories in two of the club's four tournament fishing zones, Saturday was cancelled as a tournament fishing day and the tournament was held as a one day tournament on Sunday. The next scheduled member tournament is the Grab Bag Tournament Saturday September 9 and Sunday September 10, weather permitting. The Grab Bag Tournament is sponsored by J&W Seafood, Deltaville. Target species for the tournament will be Spanish Mackerel, Bluefish and Spot. Gift cards will be awarded for the top two fish (by weight) for each species, with the first place winner of each species also receiving a plaque. Angler of the Year (AOY) points will be awarded for each species, with 4 points for first place, 3 for second, 2 for third and 1 point for all other entries.

Seventeen members have recorded one or more AOY points through the first four tournaments, with three tournaments remaining. Tom Smith with 19 points, Stuart McKenzie with 16 and Evan Gregg with 10 are leading the group. AOY standings can be found on the club's website.
