No cobia nor croaker entries were recorded.




Social Media:

FISHING TIPS For Cobia:

Sight fishing Jigs, Gaffs and Nets:

Big cobia are strong and active. I do not have to tell any of you who have tied into a 30 pound plus cobia what I'm talking about. I was on board with John O'Conner and Jan Jamrog a couple of years ago while we tried to fit a 50 pound + cobia into a net the fish obviously did not like. That fish did all it could to destroy three sets of shoulders and the net itself. So here are a couple of great videos you may want to watch on jigs for sight fishing, proper netting, netting size, and gaffing a big cobia.
